

Quarterly Update

September 2017

Highlights of Town Board Meetings

June 19:

- Licenses were approved for beer and liquor, class B beer, cigarettes, operators' and temporary beer sales.
- The culvert will be repaired soon on County Line Road.
- There were complaints about the last garbage pickup. This will be discussed with the garbage company.
- There will be police patrolling at the Firemen's dance, as well as at Lake Hilbert on July 1.
- To comply with the town ordinance, letters will be mailed to property owners who are neglecting their yards and lawns.

July 17:

- The fire department received a grant for \$27,884 from the Potawatomi Community, which will go toward a fire truck.
- The new Memorial Square sign cost \$980, of which \$750 was covered by the M&M Foundation grant.
- Dumpsters at Lake Hilbert are being misused, and bears are also a problem.
- Repair work is needed on some of the town's equipment.
- A new 30' culvert will be installed on County Line Road.
- Boulders need to be dug out of the trout pond.
- The town is seeking bids to re-surface the tennis court.
- Twin Lake will be worked on soon with wedging and chip sealing.
- The town is considering joining a court system with nearby towns.

Aug. 21:

- The town board has decided not to join the neighboring towns in their court system. They feel it would be too costly. Instead, all violations would be forwarded to the Marinette court system.
- A discussion took place on placement of sex offenders in the area after their prison term. The town is reviewing their ordinance concerning this and will also confer with the State's ruling. This will be put on the agenda for the Sept. meeting.
- Town equipment has been repaired, and work is continuing on Twin Lake Road.
- There is an error in the garbage and recycling schedule previously mailed to customers. A corrected schedule will be mailed soon.
- New flag poles will be ordered to replace those destroyed by the storm. They will be covered by the town's insurance company.
- The next town board meeting is scheduled for Sept. 18.

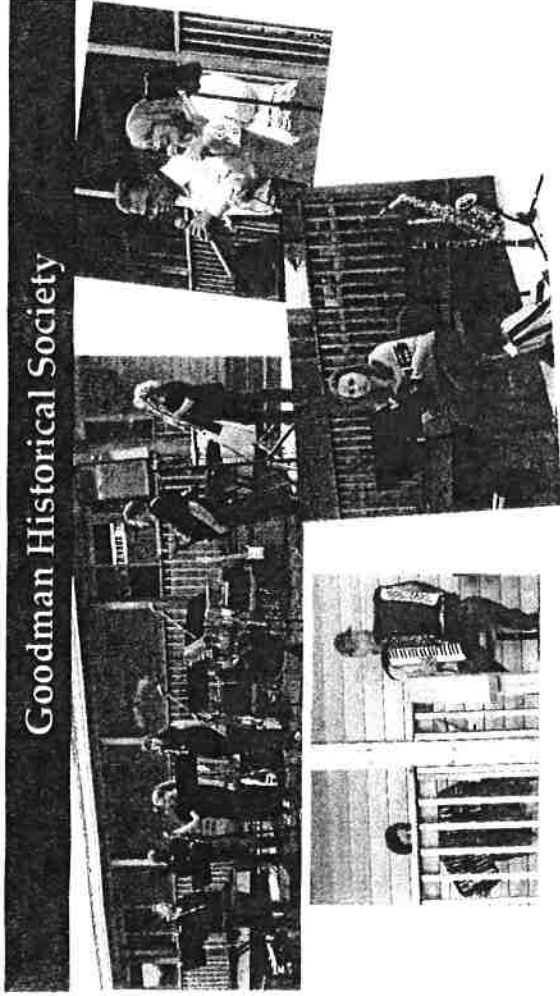
